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Chairmans Report

30 June 2014

The past year has been one of inspiring achievement and transition for Beyond the Orphanage, positioning the organisation to grow and advance with greater confidence and efficiency.

Now in its seventh year of operation, Beyond The Orphanage has continued to do what it does best, which is to respond to the globally alarming figure of vulnerable children, in particular the orphans. Beyond the Orphanage's key objective being to initially alleviate the emergency material needs and psycho-social needs of children in crisis and then set up a home and family infrastructure in which those children can safely thrive and grow into adulthood – undertaken in a country where over 5.5 million children are orphans.

Beyond the Orphanage has been in tune with the needs of this extremely vulnerable society of children and has risen to the challenges faced on a yearly, monthly and daily basis.

Our strategy and vision has long focused on human development and growth to plant and bring back the values of humanity through provision of education, health care services, awareness creation sessions, basic needs, provision of nutritional allowance, clothing, continuous psycho-social assistance among others - and each year this gets further embedded and refined as the children move through the program to successfully enter independent adulthood.

Specifically, our key achievements over the last 12 months can be summarised as follows:

- We have welcomed seven new children into the program
- Five children passed the national exam being a school exam set to determine which children will go to university and those who will be streamed into a vocation
- We have redeveloped and launched our new responsive website
- We reached our target funding on our sanitation project for 11 homes
- Beyond the Orphanage is now a member of the Australian Council for International Development (ACFID) and a signatory to the ACFID Code of Conduct.

As is expected and usual for the nature and type of our program, we have experienced a few challenges with the children in the program in terms of school attendance and behavioural issues. This is all very natural and to be expected, the children come from troubled backgrounds so as they become more secure in their surroundings challenges arise – I am pleased to say that we have not, as yet, met a challenge that we could not face due to the hard work and dedication of our committed field staff.

Here in Australia we have experienced significant growth in our supporter base despite challenging times in the development and fundraising sector. We have been fortunate enough to have some wonderfully dedicated contractors and volunteers – all of whom are the backbone of the organisation.

I would like to thank my fellow Board of Directors who have worked tremendously hard to realise the organisation's goals during 2014.

We are particularly grateful to our donors – both individual givers and our corporate supporters - who continue to give so generously and express their compassion and concern for the Ethiopia's lost generation.

Looking ahead, Beyond the Orphanage will continue to commit itself to the ongoing development of the children in its program now and into the future.

It gives me great pleasure to present our 2014 Annual Report.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the provisions of the trust deed as relevant.

The financial report covers the trust, Beyond the Orphanage Foundation.

Compliance with Australian Accounting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes also comply with International Financial Reporting Standards.

Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The Trust has chosen to change the format of the Statement of Profit and Loss and other Comprehensive Income in the current year to be compliant with the ACFID reporting format. The change has been adopted to provide more relevant descriptions of the donations received. The comparatives in the income statement have been adjusted accordingly.

(b) Comparative figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(c) Revenue and other income

The trust recognises revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of Beyond the Orphanage Foundation's activities as discussed below.

Donation revenue

Donations are recognised upon receipt from donors.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

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Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 June 2014

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies continued

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less which are convertible to a known amount of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over their useful lives to the trust commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Plant and Equipment	20%
Office Equipment	66%

The assets' residual values, depreciation methods and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

(f) Intangibles

Web site design

Intangibles, being website development is initially capitalised at cost. Once in place and being used these costs are written off over the estimated useful life of the asset. The asset's value is amortised on a systematic basis matched to the future economic benefits over the useful life.

(g) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the trust during the reporting period which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(h) Goods and services tax (GST)

The trust is not registered for GST. Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised inclusive of the amount of GST. The GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

Cash flows are presented in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

2 Change in Accounting Policy

The trust changed its accounting policy for the financial year ending 30 June 2014 with respect to distributions to be compliant with ACFID. All distributions are debited to the profit and loss rather than through equity. This change has retrospectively applied.

Report on the Financial Report

Qualification

We have obtained appropriate audit evidence regarding revenue from cash donations and other fundraising activities with respect to revenue recorded in the financial records of Beyond the Orphanage Foundation. As it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of revenue from these sources prior to entry into the financial records, our audit procedures are necessarily limited to those amounts recorded in these financial records. As a result, we are unable to express an opinion as to whether revenue from cash donations and other fundraising activities is complete.
